



Plans for a sustainable new community in Ingleside

The Minister has today released draft plans for up to 3,400 new homes in Ingleside. The plans set a high standard for sustainability and include proposals for electric vehicle recharging points, huge rainwater tanks and wildlife corridors.

The draft plans also feature a town centre, neighbourhood centre, a new primary school and other community facilities. The community will benefit from proposed road and infrastructure upgrades and improved transport options.
